In 2021, MOC continued to serve more individuals than in years past. Through our food services, Homeless Welcome Center, ESL classes, and Counseling Center, we made an impact in nearly 15,000 individuals' lives. Although the needs remain great, it is amazing how many people shared stories of overcoming homelessness and joblessness with us. We joyously celebrate with them.

In the spirit of collaboration and collective impact, we invited more people to participate in our work. Last year, our donors helped us raise more money than ever before, allowing

us to invest more lifechanging services to families in our community. In addition to our amazingly faithful volunteers, groups like the Junior League of Dallas, StitchFix, and Husch Blackwell joined our mission to proclaim to the community that they have inherent dignity and invaluable worth.

OUR IMPACT

Food Services

MOC's largest program, we help improve food security through our on-site food pantry, satellite pantries, and Food2Families grocery delivery services. We purchased a box truck in 2021 to increase capacity for food distribution.

14,752 people served542,461 pounds of food distributed, worth ~\$1 million6 DISD schools participating in Food2Families



People experiencing homelessness come to MOC daily and receive a hot lunch, snack pack, hygiene items, and clothes. Additional services include agency referrals and medical care through the Parkland HOMES mobile unit.

Adult Education

ESL classes resumed in 2021 with limited offerings and small class sizes to ensure the safety of the students and volunteers. Students in the program enjoy a tight-knit community where they get to practice and become more proficient in their English.

Counseling Center

The Center for Integrative Counseling & Psychology partners with MOC to provide free counseling services for individuals and families. A therapist is available to process through grief, depression, anxiety, and other hardships.

Hope for the Future

Late last summer I began seeing clients in person at Mission Oak Cliff. The pandemic created additional challenges for so many in the Oak Cliff area. Most of my clients have reached a point where the emotional stressors they are facing become unsustainable and they need a space to unburden the weight that they are carrying. They have faced not just one traumatic event in their lives but many different traumatic events, known as complex trauma.

When one of my clients shared a specific traumatic event from the past, we were able to normalize the coping strategies she has used to help her survive. My client is now able to work towards emotional safety when she experiences specific triggers and states "I know what I need when I am stressed."

I believe true healing for my clients happens when they can put their individual stories into words and create meaning from their experiences. The counseling room is a haven where relational trust can grow, creating a foundation for my clients to find hope for the future.



I am incredibly honored to be present for my clients in their journeys of healing and growth.

Winter Storm Relief

When the Winter Storm hit Texas, most families were stuck at home, including the majority of MOC's clients experiencing food insecurity. Volunteers worked with MOC to ensure that 300 people received groceries delivered to their doorstep.

In 2021, Mission Oak Cliff continued its partnerships with 6 local DISD schools. Through hosting a campus food pantry and participating in the Food2Families food delivery program, our partner schools are helping us increase food security in our area.

Volunteer Fights

In 2021, with a staff of just 5, Mission Oak Cliff heavily relied on a handful of individuals to make the nonprofit operate on a weekly basis. Additionally, volunteer groups served repeatedly throughout the year, making large-scale tasks possible, such as bagging groceries for 150 families each week.

As awareness of Mission Oak Cliff grew among the Dallas community, so did engagement grow among various organizations in the community. Help arrived in the form of professional volunteer groups, including Aetna, Stitch Fix, Helpful Honda, Helm ABA, Southwest Airlines, and the Junior League of Dallas. Additionally, groups from churches and schools helped: Wilshire Baptist, Heights Baptist, Park Cities Presbytarian, UNT Dallas, DBU, Peeler Elementary, and LifeSchool.

Without these 266 volunteers, it would have been nearly impossible to serve the 14,752 clients in 2021. To our volunteers: The dedication, humility, and kindness of all of you cannot be overstated or overlooked- you make the heart and soul of MOC, providing invaluable change to the Oak Cliff community.

Mission Oak Cliff will have priority focus in 2022-2024 on strengthening its adult education offerings through formal partnerships with education service providers.

Education is essential for career advancement. We recognize the direct correlation between educational attainment and financial stability. Thus, we will be focusing our efforts on ramping up our adult education program in partnership with Dallas College to provide families the opportunities to thrive.

Mission Oak Cliff will expand its food pantry services to ALL people with residence in Dallas County, lifting the 5 zip-codes restriction on January 1, 2022.

Over the past two years, we have seen an increased request to provide services from people residing outside of our 5 zip code areas. Because of our close proximity to Trinity Groves and Downtown Dallas, we decided to open our services to all of Dallas County, while remaining focused on Oak Cliff.

Mission Oak Cliff will provide free mental health counseling services for at least 100 individuals in 2022.

In partnership with The Center for Integrative Counseling and Psychology, we launched the MOC Counseling Center in 2021. In addition to providing mental health services, we are actively educating our community on the importance of mental health to help break down barriers and stigma.
